Grace Emerson Terrell, MD, MMM, FACP, FACPE is a general internist and chief executive officer of Cornerstone Health Care, P.A. an independent multi-specialty medical group in the Piedmont Triad region of North Carolina with more than 300 providers and 1500 employees who practice at nine separate hospitals. She is a Commissioner for the Certifying Commission of Health Information Technology, a Fellow of the American College of Physicians, and a Fellow of the American College of Physician Executives. Hers was the first practice in North Carolina to achieve NCQA level 3 Physician Practice Connection recognition. Her professional interests include health care economics, preventative medicine, women’s health issues, diabetes, osteoporosis, and community health issues.

Samuel Cykert, MD is a Professor of Medicine at UNC-CH. He recently completed an eighteen year tenure as a faculty member of the Greensboro Area Health Education Center and was Chief of the Internal Medicine Teaching Program there for 7 years. As part of efforts to leverage HIT with quality improvement, research and health policy to improve patient outcomes, Dr. Cykert serves as the Clinical Director of the North Carolina Regional Extension Center for Health Information Technology and as a member of the North Carolina Health Information Exchange Board. The HIE Board plays a key role in determining how North Carolina will address HIE and meaningful use requirements as defined by CMS in conjunction with Office of the National Coordinator for HIT with the explicit goal of improving health outcomes throughout the state.
